

Bristol Pegasus MC Clubmans Championship 2013

Introduction

The event will consist of a number of runs over different courses/tests. Event taking place on grass, in a single field, the event should appeal to anyone who would like a bit of fun in their car; any road car should be suitable. No competition licence is needed.



Supplementary Regulations

- 1. The Bristol Pegasus Motor Club will organise a Clubsport status Autotest on Sunday 22th of September 2013 at Sheepcot Farm, Miss Graces Lane, Tidenham Chase Chepstow, NP16 7JR. Map Reference 172/549997.
- 2. The meeting will be governed by the General Regulations of the Motor Sports Association (Incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations, and any written instructions that the organising club may issue for the event.
- 3. The MSA Permits number is XXXXXX.
- 4. The Event is open to all fully elected members of the Bristol Pegasus Motor Club and all fully elected members of the following clubs: Bath Motor Club, Bristol Motor Club, MGCC (South West Region) and Tavern Motor Club
- 5. All entrants in the event must produce a valid membership card for either the promoting club or the invited club. No competition licence is required for this event.
- 6. The programme of the meeting will be as follows: Signing on and Scrutineering starts at 10.00.

Any competitor not signed on by 10.20 may be EXCLUDED. The first car will start at 10.30.


- 7. Public roads will not be used to link sections. There will be at least four tests on private land. Each competitor will have two attempts at each test. The best time for each test will count. Details of the tests will be explained at the start of each one. A signed on front seat passengers may be carried. The entry may be split into groups starting on different sections.
- 8. The event will consist of 5 classes as follows:
- 1) Saloon Cars with engines of less than 1400cc.
- 2) Saloon Cars with engines between 1401 and 2001cc.
- 3) Saloon Cars with engines over 2001cc.
- 4) Road Sports / Kit Cars
- 5) Other cars

Any road legal tyre is acceptable for classes 1-4

All cars with engines running on diesel fuel will be subject to a 30% capacity reduction. All cars with forced induction will be subject to a factor of 30% capacity increase.

The Organisers reserve the right to merge classes should the number of entries so determine.

Eligibility for classes is at the discretion of the organisers.



Three wheel vehicles only accepted at organiser's discretion.

Competing cars may be driven or trailered to the event (note entrance into field is tight if towing). Competing cars are not required to be road legal but must comply with MSA Technical Regulations.

9. Awards will be presented as follows:-Fastest Overall The Turbine Trophy* + award First in each Class (subject to 3 starters). Second in each Class (subject to 5 starters). Third in each Class (subject to 7 starters). No competitor may win more than one award.

- * Remains the property of BPMC and will be retained by the club.
- 10. The entry list opens on publication of these regulations and closes finally at 10.20 hours 22nd September 2013.

The entry fee is £8 in advance or £10 on the day.

All entries must be made on the official entry form and accompanied by the appropriate fee. Cheques should be made payable to Bristol Pegasus Motor Club.


- 12. The maximum entry for the meeting, including reserves, is 40. The minimum is 5. Should the above minimum figure not be reached, the organisers have the right to cancel the meeting. Entries will be selected at the discretion of the organisers. Entry fees may be refunded if the entry is withdrawn and notice given in writing to the secretary of the meeting, at least 24 hours before the event is due to start.
- 13. Other officials are:

Clerk of the Course: Alan Spencer

Scrutineer: TBA Club Steward: TBA

All marshals will be Judges of Fact

- 14. Provisional results will be published by despatching a copy in writing by post within 7 days of the event.
- 15. Any protest must be lodged in accordance with C 5.1 to 5.7.
- 16. Competitors will be identified by numbers which will be provided by the organisers, if deemed necessary.



17. The starting signal will be made known at the Drivers' Briefing.

Timing will be by hand held stopwatches to the previous tenth of a second.

Timing will start on the movement of the driving wheels and stop when the vehicle stops astride an imaginary line between two markers that denotes the finish line; penalties will be recorded and applied by the Chief Timekeeper.

- 18. Best run on each course will count for results. There will be a maximum of 2 runs on each course. In the event of a tie, the faster run on the first course will determine the tie, then the faster run on the second course etc until the tie is resolved. Competitors not attempting a test will receive Maximum Time unless they declare retirement.
- 19. The STOP signal, red flag, may be displayed because of an obstruction or problem on the course. A competitor must stop safely immediately on deployment of the STOP signal, then follow Officials instructions. A re-run will be allowed. The STOP signal will be demonstrated at the driver's briefing.
- 20. Marking and penalties will be as follows:-

Time taken completing the course: Actual time taken

Striking a cone or barrier or any other course marker: 10 seconds per offence.

Taking an incorrect route on any course: Maximum Time

(However, returning to the point of departure from the correct route and then completing the route correctly will not be penalised, except as immediately below.)


Not stopping immediately on deployment of the STOP signal: Maximum Time

Not completing the course: Maximum Time.

The Maximum Time is the slowest time for that course, plus ten seconds.

- 21. All other General Regulations of the MSA apply as written.
- 22. Awards will be presented at the BPMC Annual General Meeting to be held on Monday 9th December 2013. If unable to attend the competitor is to make arrangements for award collection.


