


## Our regular venue is -BAWA Leisure Centre 589 Southmead Road, Filton, Bristol, BS34 7RG



Did I just say that?

Well it wasn't to be as the lunchtime queue for the cavalcade saw the starter motor pinon and flywheel come together at the wrong moment. A pile of shrapnel on the floor (and jingling about in the clutch area) said game over.



At lunch on Saturday I had the privilege of driving Tim Milnes' fantastic Francis Lombardi / Abarth Scorpione up the hill with the C.O. in the passenger seat. It's a

lovely thing – very docile and smooth and with an exotic feel way beyond its sub 1 litre status. I really liked it.





In the end a 57 was as far as I got – an agonising 5 secs off the Mantis but, on this hill, with all the low speed acceleration required, it was easy to see why. Must get the carbs sorted before the next event. Other than the extreme fluffiness, it was a peach to drive.



We took my daughter's lovely little 1972 Fiat 500L down to Cardiff Bay. It was the day of the Italian Passion display event outside the opera house. I had entered the Abarth but it was now sans starter motor. I also tried to enter the 500 but it was deemed not to be a 'performance car' (I think we would agree with that), so was not accepted. A Fiat Strada Cabriolet was, though, so obviously there are different views on what constitutes performance! Still, we took the 500 down and parked it 'out of the way' and it immediately got a nice crowd round it.

The Goodwood FOS is always worth a visit. This year we were joined by some friends who came in a Merc 190E – in geek speak, a W201 and predecessor to the C class. Lovely, inexpensive, modern classic which will go anywhere in comfort and style. He didn't have Air Con in it though, so, on the warm A27 drag out of Chichester, he was Betty Swollocks to say the least.

The C.O. had a hand in 'entertainment' and we ended up on the Wednesday evening at the Old Mill in Botley just off the M27. Highly recommended.



And the highlights? The Dallara Stradale, now available in the UK through Joe Macari in London, hit the spot (but it's the thick end of 200K...).



And then there was the re-launch of the De Tomaso brand. Here on its debut was the P72. Engine thought to be a choice of (Roush Ford) V8 and maybe a V12. The one going up the hill was a V12 – sounded like an AMG motor to me. I think the V8 will be more 'al la mode' for the old school.

It had the look of a late 60's Pininfarina concept car – so different to the many supercars being

launched, seemingly every month, with scoops, wings,

diffusers, dive planes and more carbon than a diesel with a blown turbo. All utterly pointless on a road car of course. I loved the look of the P72. I mean, copper wheels !



But then I mentally compared it with the 1969 Pininfarina Alfa T33 concept and, well, car styling was at its peak back then in my view. Just look at it. Small diameter wheels and tall sidewalls are the way to go.

The busy period continued with a pilgrimage to Portmerion with Club Lotus. This year it was somewhat compromised by attendance at a wedding in Cardiff on the Saturday but, though it was a quick 'up there Sunday, back down Monday;' it was worth it. I am sure most of you have sampled the mid and north Wales roads, but, if you haven't, then please do. Preferably in something small, light and agile. A nice little convoy with a couple of superbikes was going well until the C.O. proclaimed "this is quite unpleasant, diving in and out of this traffic queue"....



A little later, a fast moving train of my Lotus, a GT3RS, a McLaren 650 Spider and another GT3 was very enjoyable. For me anyway.

Once there it ...rained. Well it always does, but who cares? The return was just as good with cheery waves from a Morgan 3 wheeler and a hot Caterham. All of us having a ball. Sat in a little coffee shop, on the main square in Rhyader, along comes an Elan Sprint and an M100, two Wessex area members on their way back South avoiding the motorways. Lovely.

In over 350 miles in two days I spotted one Renault Zoe in mid Wales and one Tesla not far from Merthyr. No wonder....even 97+ Octane fuel is hard to track down. Fast chargers? I am afraid not. My word it's going to take some work to get the infrastructure in place. You can just picture the 1000's of work teams coming along to dig up the pavements and lay cables. In Diesel powered Tranny vans...





## **IMPORTANT NEWS**

## **New Motorsport UK RS Clubman licence from 2020**



The club was informed of some important changes which impacts anyone planning to compete in 2020.

For 2020 Motorsport UK is introducing the requirement for all competitors to hold a new RS Clubman licence as a minimum, which will be free of charge. If you compete, but don't currently hold a licence you will need to apply for this. These changes will affect Autotests, Trials, Cross Country, Road Rallying, 12 Cars and Scatters. Passengers will also now be required to hold an RS Clubman licence.

The RS Clubman licence can be applied for online from 18 November and aims to encourage more grass roots participation, as well ensuring all Motorsport UK event competitors are covered by comprehensive insurance. Additionally, licence holders will have access to Motorsport UK's Member Benefits Programme that includes the new upgraded personal accident cover.

As well as this change to require a free license there have been significant changes to the "permit" fees which Motorsport UK charge clubs on a per competitor basis for most competitive events.

Such fees have all increased by £5 which means it is likely we will have to increase the entry fee by a similar amount in 2020. The biggest impact will be on Car Trial and Autosolo / Autotest events where the permit fee has roughly doubled in cost. As an example for each competitor in one of our Solo events we will now have to pay Motorport UK £11.50 - we currently charge £10 entry for these events which covers both the permits and other costs of running the event.

Please note this does NOT impact our December Autosolo which fortunately is still under 2019 rules.

I had an excellent day Passengering for Mal on the Allen Trial. Things did not get off to a great start when Mal found the Marlin had a water leak and a misfire at the start, despite being fine when he took it for an MOT a couple of weeks before.

We managed to make the leak a bit better, but the misfire was stubborn and got worse throughout the day. By the time we headed to the last section, John Walker on the outskirts of Bath, we were

struggling on the road so the fact Mal made it up the section was a credit to his driving. When the results came out we had got a third class award in a class of fourteen which exceeded both our expectations.

This revealed one of the cylinders was well down compared with the others, so the plan is to start by taking the cylinder head taken off and checking the valves. Hopefully it won't be the bottom end which would be a much bigger job.

Both the Marlin and Westfield have also had new batteries - when you own cars for a long time it is easy to forget just how long ago you last changed things. When I

went to the Sparkys breakfast meet at the end of October I had to jumpstart the Westfield, despite charging the battery for days, so it was time to spend some money.

Looking forward to the Xmas Autosolo hopefully the Marlin will be ok for that subject to how the head work goes.

Finally a Happy Christmas and New Year to all members - 2020 will be our 75th Anniversary.


