## Monday 10th March Speaker - Mike Marsden The Schneider Trophy Air Races



Club member Mike Marsden has kindly agreed to give us a talk for our March Club Night. Many of you will have enjoyed Mike's past talks where he has told us about Vehicle Aerodynamics and Historic Lotus Cars. This time his talk will include gorgeous aeroplanes and big, powerful piston engines.

The Schneider Trophy was awarded to the winner of a race for seaplanes which was held twelve times between 1913 and 1931. It was intended to encourage technical advances in civil aviation but became a contest for pure speed. The events were very

popular and some attracted crowds of over 200,000 spectators. The race was significant in advancing aeroplane design, particularly in the fields of aerodynamics and engine design, and would show its results in the best fighters of WW2.

## Monday 14th April - Guest speaker - David Render



David Render returns for another instalment of his fascinating story.

Ex-military, ex-racing car driver, businessman. He has lived life to the full and all his talks are from first hand experience.

Last time we were treated to his knowledge of Competitive car racing acquired over 50 years.

This time will be telling us the story of his exploits at aged 19 years when he commanded a troop of three Sherman tanks against the might of the German Panzers Wehrmacht and SS divisions.



## BACMSC Challenge Trophy CASTLE COMBE AUTUMN CLASSIC



An historic trophy will be used to celebrate the first race for 500cc Formula 3 cars at Castle Combe for almost sixty years.

The "Bristol Aeroplane Company Motor Sports Club Challenge Trophy" race, to be run by the 500 Owners Association at the Castle Combe Autumn Classic race meeting on Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> October, will be the first race for 500s at the Wiltshire circuit since Jim Russell won in his Cooper on 1<sup>st</sup> October 1955.

To mark the occasion, and in recognition that it was at a Club meeting in Filton, Bristol, on 10<sup>th</sup> December 1945 that members initially devised the national 500cc racing car formula, the Bristol Pegasus Motor Club (BPMC), the BAC MSC successor club, has agreed to assign an historic trophy to the race.

The silver BACMSC Challenge Trophy was originally awarded in 1945 to the winner of the Bristol Sprint on Filton airfield on 28<sup>th</sup> October, Bob Gerard in his ERA. Later Gerard would successfully race Cooper 500s.

In 1948 the trophy was awarded to the best performing 500 Club Bristol & West Centre member in the Weston-Super-Mare speed trials (Jim Bosisto, Iota Buzzie 2), and in1949 at the first Lulsgate race meeting (Gerry Millington, Iota MilliUnion), so has much historic significance to early 500 racing.

Bristol Pegasus MC Chairman Andy Moss said, "We're very proud of the Club's heritage and are very pleased to have this opportunity to remember those who pioneered the 500 formula at a club meeting at Filton almost 70 years ago."

500 Owners Association Chairman Nigel Challis added, "I have visited Castle Combe circuit many times, and often thought about 500's being able to race here. When we were approached and invited by the circuit organisers in late summer 2013 to come along in October 2014, we were hugely excited about the prospect. Having raised the matter at our Club AGM in November 2013, the decision by Members to join in was about the quickest we have ever taken on any similar matter. We are sure that the event will be very well supported indeed, and we are all very keen to see how we will perform compared with historic times. We agree that 500's will add another dimension to this super event, and I am sure we will fit in very well indeed. I have recently been to Combe on a track day and enjoyed the circuit immensely.

We were further delighted by the BPMC offer to assign both the The Challenge Trophy and the Pegasus Trophy to our race, a very fitting thing indeed, but one that stands out as a hugely generous and thoughtful offer.

We are thankful to the Club, the circuit and one Marcus Pye who I understand floated an idea initially."

The Castle Combe Autumn Classic race meeting takes place on Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> October 2014. As well as our involvement in the 500 Race we will have a club display at the event.

## **Navigation Exercise - Friday 24th January 2014**

A cracking start to 2014 and major success for youth!

An excellent turn out of eight crews gathered at the Coppice Mawr start location on the B4235 just east of Shirenewton for our first event of the year.

It was pleasing to see Pete Goodman (BMW 328) arrive with his son Ben as his navigator together with Martin Baker in the back seat. Likewise Martyn Davies (Fiesta) was accompanied by daughter Katie for her third event. Both Ben and Katie surely had lots of experiences to share with their school chums on the following Monday! Returning, after some years, were Mark Austin and Matt Marples (Corsa) promising a good competitive challenge for first place.

Also prepared for the wet conditions were Chris Thompson and Alan Dillamore in their Suzuki X90. Notable was the return of Danny Castleton and Don Neate in a 'real' BL Mini demonstrating that 4WD's and other modern vehicles are not necessary to successfully compete.

This year the 26.7 mile route ran clockwise on the high ground to the west and above the Wye Valley. Route checks on the Wednesday prior to the event ensured that, with a couple of re-routes, all the roads were suitable albeit it was necessary for crews to remember that some apparent puddles were likely to be potholes.

One 'black spotted' ½ mile stretch of 'yellow' road was in fact 'white' and another had more patches than original tarmac! There was no doubt that care was also necessary given the excess of running water and debris in the roads.

That said, in my view, these conditions add to the challenge, fun and satisfaction of an event such as this. The message at the start was, as ever, drive responsibly and carefully especially given the caution expressed by the Gwent Police.

The route immediately moved west from map 162 to 171 and passed via Shirenewton then south from Llanvair Discoed, to the west side of the Wentworth Reservoir before passing through the Wentwood Forest and on to Llangwym, this being the most northerly point of the route. The competitors then headed south to Newchurch and east towards Devauden before tackling the demanding uphill climb from Bullyhole Bottom to Gaerllwyd where they reached the B4235. Running parallel to that road the route ended at the Huntsmans Hotel in Shirenewton.

First crew to arrive at the finish was Nick Wood and Andy Moss (Fiat Panda 1001P). Andy had felt nauseous in the car and they sensibly abandoned the event

albeit, until then, they had scored extremely well. Ralph Colmar and Alan Spencer (VW Golf) put in a very creditable performance, with Alan's navigational skills having significantly benefitted from recent outings in a 12 Car Rally championship, and in doing so closely beat Bob Bull and Mark Sylvester (BMW Mini Cooper S).

However the 'stars' of the evening were Katie and Ben by taking the first two places with a margin of 5 points. There can be no greater satisfaction than 'seeing' youngsters being successful. Next year Novice status beckons. Very well done. Given that the total possible winning score was 235, a score of 200 points was very commendable. My thanks to each crew for entering on an evening when you could have easily decided to stay at home. I trust you enjoyed yet another route in this area as much as I enjoy devising them.

# The 2014 Pegasus Open Speed Championship

Following the introduction of this championship last year we hope as many members as possible will register this year and claim points in the clubs own speed championship.

Members entering **any non-race speed event** can register for this and claim points for the events they enter during 2014. Each month we will keep you up to date with the latest positions

in Backfire, and we hope some of the entrants may report on the events they have entered and send in pictures of their exploits.

This is an internal closed to club challenge and there will not be a fixed calendar of events, you can claim points for any speed event you enter including our own events. We will provide you with information in Backfire about the many events the club gets invited to during the year to give you a few ideas of what you could enter. We will also be trying to add to the events club members are invited to during 2014 to give you plenty of opportunities to get out and compete.

**Registration** - Competitors must register for the championship by contacting the championship co-ordinator. Speed Championship stickers will be issued which should be displayed on your car during events.

**Number of Qualifying events -** Your best six event scores submitted during the 2014 season will count. The closing date for points to be claimed is the 1st of November 2014. To claim points mail a copy of the event results to the championship co-ordinator.

**Competitors Points** Points are awarded according to the formula

$$\left| \frac{5 (Number of Starters - Number of Finishers)}{Number of Starters} \right| + 1$$

- Points are awarded according to finishing position in class.
- Non finishers will be classed as finishing in last position.
- For tied positions, points are averaged for the number tied (eg if 2 entrants tie for 4th place, then each is given position  $4\frac{1}{2}$ ).

### **Marshalling Credit**

Entrants may make a single claim of 5 points for marshalling or organising at a Speed event. Such an event will be classed as one of the competitors 6 events.

<u>Awards</u> The top three entrants will receive awards. Ties will be decided by the most 1st place positions, followed by most 2nd place and so on.

## **Clubmans Championship**

Points will be awarded for all BPMC events entailing the use of a car. Points are awarded according to the formula.

$$\left| \frac{5 (Number of Starters - Number of Finishers)}{Number of Starters} \right| + 1$$

- Points are awarded according to finishing position in class or if there are no classes, by overall finishing position.
- Non finishers are included in number of starters and will be classed as finishing in last position.
- For tied positions, points are averaged for the number tied (eg if 2 entrants tie for 4th place, then each is given position  $4\frac{1}{2}$ ).
- The first signed-on passenger scores for Navigation Exercises, Navigation Scatters, Treasure Hunts. For the Test Day organisers points only will be awarded.
- For club events such as Touring Assemblies, Test Days etc where no result is declared members who enter will receive 2 bonus point towards the Clubmans championship. Qualifying events are defined by the club committee.
- Points will no longer be awarded for Organising or Marshalling which will be recognised separately in the Marshals Championship, however note that in order to be classified in the final championship results entrants must have marshalled or organised an event.

Awards are given to the first three in the end of year standings. In the event of a tie it will be decided by the following criteria

- 1. The person who has marshalled or organised the most events
- 2. The most 1st place positions, followed by most 2nd place and so on

## **Marshals Championship**

2 points will be awarded to marshals


1 points will be awarded for setting up an event on the day before an event
