The circuits have confirmed our dates and we have started booking the other essential items we need to make these events happen, Timekeepers, Medical Cover, Rescue Units and Scrutineers are all things that need to be sorted out early. We have also been speaking to the various championships which come along to our events and it is pleasing that most are returning again in 2017 as well as a couple of new championships joining us for the first time this year.

For the sprinters amongst you, we also have a large number of invites to other events, both individually as a club and through our membership of the regional associations. There are also plenty of opportunities to marshal both at our own events as well as some of the other local events, and of course getting involved in running the events is also a lot of fun and gives a real sense of achievement on the day. Let me know if you want to get more involved – there are always opportunities to shadow current members of the organising team, so even if you have not done this sort of thing before it is easy to get started.

As well as the sprint dates we are fortunate to have our own dedicated summer Saturday Track Day at Castle Combe – this is something that is unique to us, we are very lucky to have a Saturday date and even luckier to have been able to enjoy the activity for over 30 years. Why not add the 29th of August to your diary now!

We are again returning to Combe early in October for the Autumn Classic Race Meeting. As well as having a club display, we are pleased to be involved with the 500 Club Race, which we will be providing a Trophy for. As some of you may know the club had a big part in the creation of the 500 Formula post war and there will be a display on our club stand detailing this. The Classic Meeting is rapidly gaining a reputation of being a really good day out, and members who help out on our stand will benefit from free entry to the event. We should be able to get enough people along to spread the load of manning the stand, which will leave plenty of time to have a look around and watch the racing.

As well as the major events, we have a good social calendar lined up again next year. As well as the normal mix of club nights, speakers and car meets, we are lining up some really attractive club trips. These start with a visit to the much improved Gaydon British Motor Museum.

For those wanting low cost competition in their ordinary road car, we will again be running our Production Car Trial and two Autosolos, as well as our Navigation Event which is great fun for those driving and reading the maps. In the summer months we will have Treasure Hunts, and an evening Tour as well as the ACE Classic and Sportscar Tour, which is always a good day out.

Whatever your interest is, if it involves cars we should have plenty for you to enjoy in 2017! Make sure you keep an eye on the club magazine, which will again be published every month, as well as the internet for updates on an even more regular basis.

Saturday 18th February 2017 Club Trip - Gaydon



Bristol Pegasus Motor Club Supports New Robots Appeal

The Committee recently agreed to donate £250 on behalf of the Club to the Southmead Hospital Prostate Cancer Care Appeal. Every day in the UK Prostate cancer is diagnosed in more than 130 men.

Southmead Hospital is the one of the largest urological centres in the country. It is a designated European Centre of Excellence and one of five centres recognised by The Urology Foundation to train the next generation of robotic surgical consultants.

Robotic prostate surgery is much better for men suffering with prostate cancer than traditional methods – it's more accurate, less invasive, causes less blood loss, and reduces the length of stay in hospital. Men also have much better long term prospects for a full recovery.

Our donation will go towards purchasing two new robots for the hospital to meet growing demand, funding new diagnostic and treatment options and supporting the training of the next generation of robotic surgeons.



Well you can get a new chest, lips, stomach and arse on the NHS for free these days so maybe an antidote to collecting cars is also on the cards. Mrs Jones is making enquiries as we speak. It's been good knowing you all....



In 2015 I sold my 1972 Lotus Europa TC and quickly regretted it. Why did I sell after so much effort to get it perfect? And it was perfect. Well, as usual I ran out of space and time and decided a clean out was in order. So it went to a good home and for a small profit. All was well.

Then I did the same with my 1970 S4FHC Elan SE. Lots of work done and lots of grazed knuckles but the boys and I enjoyed fettling it. Lovely car but

low geared and when you live in Cardiff, the classic car world is a motorway trip away. So it went in Feb 2016, also for a small profit. Interestingly, it's back on the market for guite a lot more....

Then the Club Lotus membership came up for renewal in April and clearly I did not need to be a member any more. But I renewed. Uh Oh.

And so the first flickerings of the next Lotus came to pass. The magazine articles – they go back to least 2000 and it's getting silly – and the web, carandclassic.co.uk being the centre of my universe, played their part. Thing is you get sucked in like quicksand.

It was to be an Esprit. A bit like a giant Europa with longer gearing a little more long distance comfort. Always wanted



one and now they are on their way up, if I wanted one then they would unlikely be cheaper in the future.

We had that 'investment' discussion at home and Mrs Jones sat looking at me with a blank face. After I had fully debriefed her on the merits of a Lotus Esprit, I checked

to see if she was a) listening, b) interested. Her answer was..."do you want tea or coffee".

I took that to mean 'yes I am in full support, I get it and you crack on old son'. So I did. Off to London with young Owen – who is also partial to a Lotus it must be said – to view an early dry sump Turbo in black. It was sat on early Compomotive split rims and not many had those so spec wise it was all the go. The vendor was a super guy and we had a nice spin, me piloting on the return leg. My word it drove well. Quite gentle in its delivery, no obstructive gear changes, it just went. Not quick by today's standards but plenty for a classic. Externally it was a little tatty but very honest.

We retreated to consider. I am a bit of a fusspot with my cars so, for me, the paint needed doing and it needed a fair bit of engine bay sorting, interior 'sticking things back on' type work. And then there is the dry sump motor. Very rare and collectible but as far as I know dry sump oil pumps for them are getting a little scarce. Maybe a Turbo HC, late model, was a better bet.



And then there it was. Bing – right in front of my eyes, an early (1978) S2. Normally aspirated 1973cc, original Chapman strut rear end (OK ish in a 2 litre with less vibes than the later 2.2) and those fabulous Speedline wheels. The ride height looked right and it had a replacement Galv chassis. Lloyd and I headed up (including an over nighter on my hotel 'frequent flyer' points – so free) and it looked amazing. The original Guigiaro shape with no spoilers or body kit to spoil it. There's lovely isn't it?

A deal was done and, remembering that I have never bought an old Lotus that goes properly, no matter what the seller says, I had it delivered. Best to breakdown near home the first time I always say.

Since then it has not broken down! My local Lotus guru who has done a fair bit on my cars in the past has had a fettle. So the comedy wiring at the front which

threatened to cook us all has been sorted, new ally rad and fans and a good used rear hub. That's about it. I have ordered a stainless exhaust as this one is a bit blowy but it's about there. Goes well, great oil pressure, no drips on the garage floor – yes really – and lovely gearchange and clutch. When you drive it, people smile and there is no animosity. Perhaps it's the surprise that it is moving under its own steam? It has that supercar feel of lying down and looking through an enormous windscreen. I think it's got 90% of what a Ferrari 308 has got but for 25% of the price. But then I am probably biased.

Next year I have booked for Mrs Jones and I to do a weekend with Club Lotus which involves going a long way in it, looking at and talking about cars all weekend and no doubt a fair few sherbets, some even in a dinner jacket. I know she is going to love every minute.

Perhaps a new arse on the NHS will be what I need after mine has been kicked into a new, abnormal shape...










Airfield Sprints

Ralph Colmar continued as editor this year. Ralph depends on contributions - please keep sending in the articles. Thanks to those who contributed on 2016.





He has contributed to the club throughout 2016, whether it is through competing, organising events or arranging activities that we have all enjoyed.


Many of the events he has arranged have been on the social side of the clubs calendar, and this aspect of our activities is key to building a strong club that has the resources to organise high quality competitive events.
