

The next Monday we were meeting again for the first Treasure Hunt of the year, which took in some excellent roads before finishing for a drink and a chat at Cromhall.

Finally, it was off to South Wales for the Llandow sprint. This year I took on a new role as Secretary, and I was grateful that I had lots of help from Donny Allen and Entries Secretary Cherry Robinson. The clerking team was led by Glyn Hopkins and Tony Streeting from Bristol Motor Club who did an excellent job - they were also joined by Nick Wood as assistant. I must also thank all the Marshals, some of whom travelled long distances to help out on the day - they included my wife Liz who was marshalling for the first time, and seemed to enjoy herself spending the day on the post with Alan Spencer.

On my own car front, I have been working on the Marlin again with Martin Emsley, we took it out on the treasure hunt, and it went quite well. The journey home was the first time I have driven it in the dark, and we concluded the headlights could do with some improvement, a shame we did not take a torch as it may have lit the road better! The plan was then to slightly adjust the mixture the next evening, but this somehow turned in to rebuilding the carbs Thanks Martin for all you help. I have also recently had the Rover out for the first time this year, and was a little surprised to find the water level a little low following it's winter hibernation. The Rover has an aluminium block with bolted on side plates to the water jacket around the cylinders. These are well know for corroding, and as the car is about to celebrate it's 40th birthday, it is not surprising they are starting to show the signs of age. I had replaced the offside one in the past, but the passenger side has developed a hairline crack and a pin hole - this will need replacing, but with time running short before the ACE Classic Tour, it





Back to Nick's mate 'Whizzo' and after his rantings about how seriously good his biography written by Paul Lawrence (same person who collaborated with Pete Stowe on the Castle Combe book, which reminds me I want to get the new edition) I gave in and purchased a copy. What a read, I have only dipped in so far but thoroughly enjoyed it, there are many more great stories, am of the opinion that if I start at the front I will not be able to put it down. For me it makes a difference reading a book like this when you have met the person

even if briefly. Will report back in due course if I remember. Mind you I have quite a few books on my shelves to be read at the moment, I have had the matching set of Bruce Mclaren, Denny Hulme & Chris Amon for over a year and have yet to open them. Got into one of my Christmas books a while back: Haynes manual of the Avro Lancaster; An insight to owning, restoring, servicing and flying Britain's legendary World War II bomber. Fantastic book that I backed up by reading Lancaster; The Biography written by a 617 (Dam Busters Sqn) pilot from many different perspectives. Far from being dry and just facts is an insight, as seen by the people who designed, built, flew, serviced and fought against them. This is an outstanding read which has kept me enthralled for hours, thoroughly recommended.



Now I love the Haynes Aviation series 'manuals' and can only commend them with great illustrations and interesting read but also very well assembled. I see that in 2010 one for the Lunar Module and also for Concorde will be available, put them on my Christmas list,



especially the 'Module' one. I was lucky enough to see genuine Apollo space capsules at the Smithsonian Museum in Washington and I was just amazed at the size (how small) and the sheer bravery of men climbing aboard and actually venturing to space and returning. It kind of took the space thing for me from being something on TV to reality and I am still amazed every time I think about it. Forthcoming and especially of interest to me; David Tremayne has come up with a definitive history of WSR. He is an absolutely brilliant writer and speed record enthusiast, and also soon to be released is a book covering Donald Campbell's Bluebird CN7 record car.

I seem to recall in my review of Race Retro mentioning 'Whizzo' in relation to the JCB backed Hillman Hunter on the World cup Rally 40th anniversary stand but I could not find any record of this from the original event. Well here his book came in really useful; seems that he tackled the 1993 London – Sidney Marathon in the car, I love Barrie's view of the thing 'The car was crap' and after a series of adventures in a poorly prepared car it was retired in India. Defiantly a recommended read, plus a rare occurrence, some of the stories made me laugh out loud. There was of course also a Hillman backed by JCB on the 1970 World Cup Rally but it was a Minx GT, whatever the difference is between that and a Hunter, or was it the same car in both events? Don't see many of either on the road these days though and when I think back only a short time I am amazed by the number of vehicles we used to see in large numbers that have simply disappeared; the Ford Sierra being a prime example.

One of the best things I saw at Race retro being the Daf 55 Coupe and Chevrolet Beetle Super Saloons, both V8s and both lovingly restored to their former glory. I for one am amazed at the ingenuity and engineering skill which went into the construction of these two and many others, though I am only too aware that others of the genre were crude in comparison, and that some have been turned back into the original machines



they were created from which may have been obsolete of little value in period but are now of increased worth. The Daf and Beetle are so different in their approach to the same big power challenge and I think just brilliant. I had a quick scoot on the web, whatever did we do before it?

VW Type 3 Fastback - Better known as the DFVW(DFV engine, VW car), Colin Hawker



built and raced this car for a few years in the Super Saloon Championships. It was a thinly disguised Formula One car and its Ford Cosworth DFV engine would have been pushing out some 500-600bhp. Volkswagen's Type 3 was not a common sight on British roads and its use as a racer would have been laughable in standard form. What made it suitable to become a Super Saloon was its rear engine set-up (converted to mid-engine), its stable long wheelbase and its better than average wind resistance. I have seen it referred to, incorrectly, as a VW411 which although a coupe is a more boxy shape.

So what about the George Douglas / Phil Lomas Skoda which raced in the special GT Chamionship at Castle Combe, and Ian Hall's Darrian and Tony Sugden and and? So many interesting cars and drivers. And that is all you are going to get because I know there are readers out there who can tell of Supersaloons & special GTs much better than I, just hope they are inspired to get to the keyboard.












Rex's Ramblings By Rex Meaden

MG MAGNETTES

Last year, on holiday, as recorded in these pages, I bought a copy of CLASSICS MONTHLY, as it had an article centred on our own Gerry Bath and the restoration of his Lotus Elite. For this years holiday I bought a copy of CLASSICS MONTHLY again, as it had a 6-page exposé of the venerable MG Z-series Magnette. I must say that this was an excellent, well-balanced article, highlighting all the pluses and minuses of this particular model, as well as listing potential improvements, such as MGB engines, 5-speed boxes, disc brakes, and so on.

This was of special interest to me as I have an example of this car in may garage. Or rather I had one there, but have had to move it (and the rest of the fleet) to other quarters while the garage is being extended and its flat roof converted to a sloping one. The MG had to be trailered away, as it's been off the road for nearly 40 years, and it was quite evocative following the old girl back in the open air again for the first time in probably 25 years. The aim is to get it back on the road again, possibly with a few modifications to make it more usable under current conditions. It's in very good basic condition but needs a good go through to get it back on the road. The provenance is excellent, as I've known the car since it was new as it was purchased by a neighbour. My grandfather was the second owner in 1965, and it came off the road due to ill health in about 1971, with just 38,000 miles on the clock.







Coincidentally, CLASSIC and SPORTS CAR magazine are running a ZB at the moment as well, also Bristol registered, but a bit earlier than mine (theirs is 919 AHT, registered late 1957, mine is 948 CHT, registered June 1958). The reporter clearly likes it and has incorporated sensible modifications, such as rear seat belts.

When will work start? Well, it was due to be started some years ago, but a wedding got in the way, then a family, then a house extension, and now another addition to the family (due December), so who knows. But it will be done. One day.

OF MOTORING INTEREST IN THE LAKE DISTRICT

I've just returned from a relaxing family holiday in Keswick. This included 3 steam railways of various gauges for my train-mad son (he'll learn!), and Beatrix Potter places for Caroline. Following my motoring interest we visited the **CARS AND STARS MOTOR MUSEUM** in the middle of the town.

A number of the cars are genuine originals from the films and tv shows that made them famous and are great to see. There was 'The Koach' made by George Barris for The Munsters, and FAB 15, Lady Penelope's 6-wheel Rolls Royce. The 'A'-team van is there, as is Chitty-Chitty-Bang-Bang, GEN 15, the Ford Torino of Starsky and Hutch, Mr Bean's Mini, and Del and Rodneys Reliant Regal Supervan, to name but a few.

Others on display may not have quite the same provenance, such as the Harry Potter 105E Anglia (but it was the one offered by the Sun newspaper as a prize in a competition), a Back-to-the-Future' De Lorean, or 3 versions of The Batmobile. Nevertheless, the collection is well-presented and is worth a visit. Sadly I didn't make it to the Bond Museum close by.....

I did however, go to the new **LAKELAND MOTOR MUSEUM** at Newby Bridge, formerly at Holker Hall. The advertisements all said 'Open Mid-May', but when we got there the museum was clearly not finished or ready to receive visitors. We unloaded ourselves anyway and decided to see what we could see. We explained our plight to a young lady working at an open side door, explaining that we'd come all the way from Bristol to see this collection. It turned out that she was the owners wife and proceeded to give us a conducted whirlwind tour.



The setting is good and the layout was imaginative, although the Bluebird collection is in another building and that wasn't open – shame, but a good reason to return. Although the cars were interesting enough, and the vehicles were mostly in good condition, there were few headline vehicles, but there was plenty of bicycles, motor-bikes and so on, and an excellent collection of automobilia, with loads of cabinets

full of the stuff on the second floor. We thanked our hostess profusely, and promised to put in a good word. There is clearly a lot of enthusiasm surrounding this Museum, so I would search it out next time you're in the area.

All for now, and keep enjoying your cars!



Wider regulation consultation

Regular visitors to the MSA website will have noticed that proposed rule changes for consultation are now posted in the News section. These relate to the regulations in the MSA Competitors' and Officials' Yearbook and MSA Kart Race Yearbook, which are updated and published at the beginning of each year. Printed versions of the Yearbook(s) are sent to MSA licence holders and digital versions can be downloaded from the MSA website (see below).

Previously, the consultation process was solely conducted via Motorsports Now! – the MSA publication sent to licence holders quarterly. In order to improve the consultation process, the Motor Sports Council has agreed that any proposed changes to regulations (made by MSA Specialist Committees) should also be made available on the MSA website.

Consultation for all Specialist Committee proposed regulation changes closes on 20 August 2010. However, we encourage you to make any comments on proposed changes to regulations prior to the next meeting of the respective committee where possible (see below).

Kart Sporting Committee – 10 August

Award for motor sport road safety DVD

The Capita Symonds' Casualty Reduction Programme, based in Blackburn with Darwen in the North West of England, was developed during 2009 to include signposting young people to become involved with local motor sport clubs and events as positive diversionary activities. The message was that motor sport competitors drive fast but safely because they have to conform to the regulations imposed by the MSA – regarding the type of event, the type and preparation of the vehicle and the experience of the driver.

The MSA assisted Capita Symonds in developing a DVD of its Casualty Reduction Programme to highlight this link and this was shown at some of the Safety Seminars held last year. This DVD (limited copies of which are available from the MSA on request) was recently given a highly commended award by the Chartered Institution of Highways & Transportation in the North West Safety Project of the year category.

Ilkley - more than 100 years on

Ilkley & District Motor Club has joined the list of clubs which have celebrated 100-year anniversaries. To mark the milestone, Alistair Tullie, President of Ilkley & District Motor Club, was presented with one of the Centenary Club Awards specially commissioned by the MSA.
