Once again we made our regular trip to Llandow Circuit in South Wales for our first sprint of the year. The organisation of the May event normally starts just after Christmas, as well as some regular team members we were pleased to welcome a new face to the team. Having performed secretarial role in recent vears. I handed things

over to Andrew Meek from Bristol this year. This meant I could take a slightly less hands on role in helping to organise things this year. Zoe Tooth was again entries secretary with husband Mark joining the team as Chief Marshal. Nick Wood was again clerk of Course, with Chris Thompson continuing his Clerks training as Assistant Clerk. Glyn Hopkins from BMC would be deputy, but as he now does not live locally, he would not be able to get involved in the pre-event planning. Tim Murray would again handle Radio Control, with Barry Green performing the important role of operating the safety button to ensure a safe gap was kept between cars. We therefore had our core organising committee arranged with good representation from both clubs.

Early on we found out that Historic Austin 7 championship, would not be joining us this year. This meant we had to think carefully about whether we would get enough entries. To help with this we again had the Downton Engineering Mini Championship and were also pleased to again be able to welcome the MG Car Club as an invited Championship. Bristol also brought a good number of Mazda MX5s from their MX5 Challenge series, and of course we had both the ASWMC and



Welsh regional championships which have also been strong supporters of the event.

Entries soon started to roll in and it was clear the event was going to be popular again. Entries peaked in the low 90's which was very pleasing. As the event got nearer more volunteers were drafted in to help. Mal Allen volunteered for Startline duties along with Mike Cole from Bristol and

Charlie Cartright. The startline itself is always a vital part of the event, and an experienced team here is vital to the safe and efficient running of the event. My wife Liz volunteered as paddock marshal and we also managed to enlist some enthusiastic youngsters in the Paddock with Sam Thompson being joined for the first time by younger brother Thomas - both did an excellent job of rounding up competitors when they were due to run. Back in control, another vital part of the operation was entering times onto the computer to allow us to prepare printed results after the event, and regular Ben Goodman once again did a great job. Donny Allen help out with signing on and brought her secretarial experience to helping with the paperwork and times during the day. We were also lucky to have two experienced Club Stewards in Paul Hemming and Dave Cutcliffe.

As always we need the support of quite a few people from outside the club to run the event. The rescue unit was supplied by the Midland Hillclimb Championship who have had a long association with us, having provided rescue at Colerne for many years. A team of MSA licensed scrutineers were organised, along with a noise scrutineer. St John's provided us with an Ambulance and we had a Paramedic in attendance without whom the event could not happen. Once again the time keeping team was headed by Tony Parker, who has timed the Pegasus Sprint for many years, along with Swansea motor club member Neil Samuel acting as assistant. Tony and Neil are real enthusiasts and do an excellent job.

So, to the event itself. It was great to see a good Pegasus entry – 15 entries being an excellent effort. The weather was showery in the morning and we had a couple

Geoff Healey (1932 - 2016)

It is with regret that we announce the passing of Geoff Healey who had been an honorary member of our club since the mid 1970's. At that time Geoff had his own insurance brokerage business with premises in both Bristol and Thornbury and assisted us greatly when the, then, BACMC, was not RAC affiliated. Geoff was a past member of local Round Table, 41 Club and Rotary clubs and was well known, given his involvement in the activities of each of these clubs, in the wider Bristol area.

His passion was, however, motor sport and as such his particular interest was hill climbing and sprinting. In fact Geoff entered our initial Two Club meeting which was held at Wroughton prior to the move to Colerne in 1998. Subsequently he provided commentary at both the Wessex and Two Club events for many years when his deep and accurate knowledge combined with rapid recall and prestigous memory became a hallmark of his humourous style. His commentary skills were also employed, on occasion, at Castle Combe, Silverstone and regularly at Wiscombe. Latterly he act as a club Steward at Colerne.

In the time before he moved to Bristol from north London he claimed to be Jem Marsh's first salesman of Marcos cars.

An MG enthusiast throughout his life, Geoff owned both a famous 'Dundrod' MGA and a John Chatham built MGC Sebring replica. He was also a member of both the MGCC and Woolbridge clubs.

Many of us have lost a man whose friendship was very rewarding.

It's an uphill struggle

Start of the 2016 season in the Soup Dragon

The start of 2016 and car prep is the focus in Feb and March. The annual, self-inflicted, bonnet rebuild – GRP, paint, bonnet hinges etc. – is completed and it looks like new thanks to Redline Sportscars. It's mostly repairs this time but I have added a lightweight flywheel, new clutch and gone to MSA 1A tyres for this year.

The Classic Marques Speed Challenge is at 54 entries by March. The handicap system on power: weight ratio and tyres means that I was tempted to gamble going from 1B to 1A tyres in return for a 2.5% handicap advantage. At hillclimbs, the Yokohama AD08Rs were still pretty much cold at the top of the hill so I very much doubt I was getting real benefit from them. The only places that they really melted were Goodwood, Lyden and Croft and they were superb there. It's a gamble but we'll see what the Yokohama V105s are like this year.



To encourage mass use of a common rolling road — surely the way to go for a championship like this - CMSCC put a deal together with Northampton Motorsport so I took the Soup Dragon there on Saturday March 5th to run alongside the V8 TVRs. The next session was for 4 cylinder cars like MGs, Honda S2000s and MX5s. The morning had a bit of a 'start of the season' feel and

Northampton Motorsport are very well set up. The Soup Dragon only made 280bhp on the rollers vs 301 last year on a different rolling road. I suspect some of the difference is the rolling road change but it will be interesting to see what it's like at the end of the season. The lower ratio diff - changed mid 2015 - is the only other potential factor. The ratio should not 'change' anything but I suspect more drag in it.

On the same day a Griff 500 managed 314, a 4.5 Litre Chimaera only 216 (but later re ran at 239 which is better) and a 4.2 Cerbera made 349 on a recently refreshed engine (so it was spot on). So the cars were all over the place really.

First event of the season was Croft on bank holiday Monday March 28th. Both boys joined me, Lloyd competing in the one event he will get done before his A levels.

Last year Darlington was a long way from Cardiff, this year it was even further as we combined a family event in North Wales on the (Good) Friday. Yes, we trailered the Soup Dragon all the way to North Wales, unhitched it and left it at the hotel and then re hitched and carried on to Darlington on the Saturday. Complete madness.

Come Sunday in the vast paddock it started to lash down. The track walk was bloody miserable but at least the view was nice. Bank Holiday Monday dawned and though the track was very wet, the wind was up – in and out of the car – and the track started to dry late morning. Young Lloyd was only driving the car for the third time ever and again in the wet. He must think there is no such thing as a dry lap.

Last year I got to 100 secs in the bone dry but it was my first time there so I hoped to do better this time notwithstanding the fact that we were now on 1A tyres. As it turned out, I ran 117 and then 115 in the (very) wet which seemed to be fairly competitive and as it started to dry got to 103 in the first timed run – so all to play for and more to come. Except that the Soup Dragon decided to try and throw off what was left of its mashed up serpentine belt and I did not have a spare one with me so retirement from the last run seemed the prudent thing to do rather than risk sudden loss of power steering (crash) and no water pump (bang).

Lloyd got to 112 before the belt had its moment and was at that point going 12 – 13 secs faster each run so clearly I was going to be in jeopardy by the end.

The run back home on Bank Holiday Monday – all 350 miles of it – went without event and back home the spare belt flew on in 10 mins and all was well again. Joe at Redline kindly lent me a spare idler pulley in case the bearing had failed and caused a misalignment but in fact it was OK.

A wash and nut / bolt check later and it was ready for Gurston on 16th / 17th April.

My previous best at Gurston of 40.09 was just not quick enough in what is now a very competitive championship. This year the 1As would send me backwards but the lower diff should benefit me. The net result? Who knows, but Gurston's steep uphill finish killed the Mantis last year with its high diff and weight.

Friday night traffic from Cardiff to Salisbury is always glorious fun but young Owen and I got off lightly. A walk of the track showed Karousel to have been re surfaced and it looked black and oily which promised much with rain forecast the next day... The trailer field / camp site was thick with mud and a tractor and Mitsubishi 4WD had been towing the vans and trailers IN. Glad I brought the Jeep.

And the next day was horrible. Legs and hands numb, track slippery and times crap. The sun came out in the afternoon and after much effort and head scratching I ended up at 42.28 which was strangely slow even with the dodgy weather and 1A tyres.

Fortunately, Sunday was truly lovely and with 21 cars in the Classic Marques class it was very competitive. More head scratching. The 1A tyres were working very well and I honestly could not see much loss vs the 1Bs. Terminal speed over the line at the top was a problem though – 88mph last year and only 84 this year – with a lower diff. Something's not right.

It was an intellectual challenge to work it out and as I am not that way inclined, I could not work it out. Luckily I had a 12 year-old with me and so he worked up a plan and told me what to do. He must get it from his mother.

Off he went to the Jeep and came back with a set of Allen keys and a quarter inch ratchet and he set about backing off angle from the rear wing – 'less drag means more mph over the line Dad'. Quite.

We both started to get suspicious about the new lower diff. I feel like it has more drag in it. The rollers say we have lost power at the wheels. I am wondering whether those missing horses are lying in the diff somewhere. Anyway – let's try the wing. Two balls out attempts later and indeed we were faster over the line – 87mph. Still should be quicker than last year but at least we have recovered something. We ended up at 40.75 which is off last year and not the time that goes with the effort. Photo by Phil Ludbrook



Next data point was Goodwood. A rush down to Chichester on Friday evening – well rushing to nowhere as the A34 was at a standstill. There is that old gag about 'if you run you'll just miss it' and so we arrived at Goodwood at 18:34, just 4 mins after the gates 'might be closed' and it was like a graveyard. I reckon it had been shut for some while. So a comedy ensued trying to park the trailer at a busy Premier Inn at a retail park. Is now the time to take up Golf or basket weaving?

Saturday arrived and at least it was dry, if a little cold. A decent turnout of 10 cars in Classic Marques and once again we had a class. Practice is a standing start lap plus a flyer, all in one go. I ran 109 secs which is OK for practice and compares with 100.04 best last year. A clumsy gear change – 5th when I wanted 3rd into St Marys –



spoilt it a bit but otherwise it was OK. Young Owen once again placed his GPS phone in the door pocket – it's a Welsh data logger! – and it showed only 122 mph max which would be the Lavant straight. That's 5mph down on last year and it's a good 15mph down on the Griff 500. Hmmm, this is going to be hard work.

This was my third time at Goodwood – of course at a Sprint you really don't get much track time – and I felt better through the front half of the circuit taking Fordwater flat after a little discussion with myself that involved various swear words and shouting "Mummy" in my helmet. No-Name corner was now 4th gear and so was St Marys by the end of the day so we were definitely making progress. Obviously I was losing a lot down the back straight.

We ended up 5 secs slower than last year at 105.

So a bit of head scratching and that thing called 'thinking' to be done before Prescott to work out where the missing time / power / pace has gone vs last year. In discussions with another competitor over the weekend, he leant in through the window and shouted:

"How's it going?". I replied:

"It's a bit like Golf...and I can't do that either!"


