

#### It's an uphill struggle....

#### Spring has sprung...

I was not entered in the GRRC Members Sprint at Goodwood due to excessive levels of dithering and schedule changes on my part. But I had promised Lloyd that I would go and throw a few spanners around the paddock, if it turned out that I was free. And I was. And the C.O. even came along to grace us with her presence.

A much-anticipated 'Daily Mail' bank holiday queue and fuel shortage turned out to be nothing of the sort and we happily guzzled E10 at £1.68 a litre (looking like a bargain now isn't it?) at the rate of 17mpg towing with the Hemi Jeep.

And who's idea was it to swap the efficient 3.0 Diesel for a 6.4 litre Hemi? Oh yes, mine.

It looks like a daft idea, back in 2018, to buy this monster but, dear readers, it narrowly beat my second placed (even worse) idea, which was to buy an old Silver Shadow or Bentley T series, so that we could tour France and Switzerland that year and then sell it when we got home. The C.O. was not impressed with my imaginative idea, so I compromised and took the 'sensible option' of swapping the Diesel Jeep for a Hemi. I must say I have not regretted it one moment. It's now done 54K and – touching my wooden head (?) - it's never had a problem other than being hacked and losing its ECU memory in Asda's car park. It's a brilliant machine.

Anyway, back to Goodwood.

Early drama, in the form of highly observant scrutineering, had Lloyd and I scouring the paddock looking for a third (yes third) throttle spring. But we were saved from the -anticipated - early trailer journey home by a very helpful F. Ford driver. Once that was out of the way it was down to action.



The event ran as a single practice lap and then 3 timed runs. Lloyd was in a class of 17, under 2 litre, pre-1980 cars, including Mini Coopers, Alfa 105s, an Abarth

1000TC (an MBG car), Dolly Sprint, A30, FIA MGB, Lotus Elan and, next door, a Fiat 124 Spider. It was a treat to see them all.



Lloyd had not run at Goodwood since 2017 and then only his second time there in the V8 Mantis. The 1800GT had not run, in anger, since the Llandow test last year. It wasn't exactly world class preparation.





But, by mid-afternoon, he was 3<sup>rd</sup> in class, tussling with a beautifully prepared and well driven, FIA MGB roadster running 4<sup>th</sup>, trailing a rapid Dolly Sprint in 2<sup>nd</sup> and a very fast, Swift engined Mini, leading the pack by some margin. Clearly the Mini was long gone, but the others were in range and the third run was a good one, creating minor crowd excitement from the excellent vantage point on top of the pit building, as the Marcos caught the Dolly Sprint to the extent of needing some sharp braking and locked front wheels to slow after the finish line. Ooh, ahh, said the crowd.



It was enough for 2<sup>nd</sup> in class, so we trailered home as a happy family.

The V Box was a bit in and out as we couldn't always get a GPS signal but, on the second run, it recorded 121mph down the Lavant straight. As the final run was 3 secs faster (clearly the learning curve had not ended yet), I suspect the 1800GT got into the high 120s. This compares with my 135 max. in the V8 Mantis. So, the 1800 is not far off and we both think it can match the Mantis over a lap, but perhaps not the peak speed.



The pics showed some roll induced understeer on corner entry, before it reaches steady state, at which point it disappears and all is well. So, we are going to try a slightly thicker front AR bar and see if we can calm it down. That should help carry a bit more into and through the corners and therefore down the straights. It used no fluids, caused no bother all weekend and sounded grand on full bore. It's a lovely thing.

The trickiest part of running the 1800GT is actually getting in and out of it. Lloyd is a bit more agile than me so he can put his pudding bowl and Hans on first and then bend double over the door bar to slip in, provided the steering wheel is detached. Me, I have to go in head-first, arse pointing North at the sky and then spin round in the seat. Subsequently putting the helmet and Hans on in the car is like trying to pull a ferret out of your trouser leg with a blindfold on but, once settled, it's a strangely welcoming and comfy place.



The next outing looks like the MAC championship Shelsley meeting in May. Before then, we will change the bar and drop the oil in readiness.

Let's hope we don't have any more pandemics, wars, fuel protests, bad backs... or 'Easter Throttle Spring' hunts...

### **Motorsport UK RS Clubman licence**



#### Renew or Apply for your free 2022 Licence now!

From 2020 Motorsport UK introduced a requirement for all competitors to hold a new RS Clubman licence as a minimum, which is free of charge. If you compete, but don't currently hold a licence you will need to apply for this. These changes will affect Autotests, Trials, Cross Country, Road Rallying, 12 Cars and Scatters. Passengers will also now be required to hold an RS Clubman licence.

The RS Clubman licence can be applied for online and aims to encourage more grass roots participation, as well ensuring all Motorsport UK event competitors are covered by comprehensive insurance. Additionally, licence holders will have access to Motorsport UK's Member Benefits Programme that includes the new upgraded personal accident cover.






