### It's an uphill struggle

#### Driving round and round but going nowhere...

It was a lovely early winter morning and Owen and I needed to be over in Gloucestershire. Let's go in the Esprit!

The A449 just South of Monmouth always gives me the shivers when in a classic – memories of the front brakes locking on solid in the Porsche 928 come flooding back as I pass 'that layby'. But no, all was well and the Lotus was humming along. I had forgotten my sun glasses so in the shallow raked windscreen I could see 3/5ths of nothing but I was obviously directionally correct as we 'got there'.

The old A40 in from Ross on Wye was made for 1970s mid-engined cars and I was all excited in anticipation. It seems it was also made for articulated tankers and we followed one for the entire duration. Still, it gave Owen and me the chance to chat about pressurised couplings as we studied the rear of the tanker. It was all a bit British and 'whistling a happy tune'.

Just before the A417 there is a super farm shop and we decided that a snack would be appropriate. I kid you not, their cheese and bacon turnovers are the best. Whole piece of bacon rather than 'shavings' and nice strong cheddar. With a cheeky Latte is was heaven. We decided to eat outside and admire the Lotus.

We weren't the only ones. Along came a group of lads with muddy boots and ruck sacks on some sort of 'Duke of Bronze medal award'. Loud boy at the front was demonstrating his 'leadership qualities' by talking more than anyone else.

He approached the Lotus, stopped and exclaimed... 'Wow...a DeLorean'. Quite. We had little titter to ourselves and then hopped in for the remainder of the trip. All went smoothly until we stopped at a Starbucks on the way home.

With people sat in the window 'in view', I managed a comedy moment cranking the hot engine without flooring the throttle. Splutter. Instead of letting it dry off a few seconds, I compounded the problem by having another go with the throttle wide open. It started all right but with a bang like a back street in Bosnia. Owen's comment was ...'Just go...quick...people are looking'.

You know that food is close to cars in my heart and the next jaunt also ended at a coffee shop. This time at the



Old Prison in Northleach. I often go there for business meetings – better than a boring office in my view. The ladies there do a very nice job of looking after me and the Brie, Cranberry and Bacon Panini is off the scale.

This time I met a former colleague who is also a petrol head. We were meant to be talking work but of course we did not get past cars.

He has owned a couple of Porsche 991s (liked them a lot) and a BMW M4 (not impressed). Having run a couple of more sane cars in between - well a 400bhp chipped Golf R - he got the RWD spirit back in him and went for a BMW M2.

Not a week a later, some toe rags (sorry, equally valued members of society) popped it up on bricks in the car park of the Coventry Hilton. They did not manage to get the wheels off, but they did manage to smash the rear screen, rip up the rear shelf trying to access the boot, scratch the boot and the roof and generally mess it up. An insurance re spray later and sinkage marks appear. So it all had to be done again. He was beside himself. This is a man who details his wheels with a toothbrush every weekend.



As a way of recovering, he slipped into DMS tuning in the Midlands and had it chipped to 420bhp. It goes rather well apparently...

So what of the Monteverdi then? Well Bonham's came back and said it was down in Southampton in a storage unit and I was welcome to view it. So Lloyd and I did just that.

Fortunately they were not ready for us so it was up on a ramp – which allowed us a good view of its underside. We crawled over it for about 45 mins with a torch and magnet. The good news

was that it was complete – almost – and structurally looked decent. Monteverdi used truly massive box sections for their chassis – never seen anything like it.

However, it was in need of a complete resto. That in itself was not an issue but everything is bespoke so it's not the easiest of projects. Still, I noted down my questions for Bonham's and they kindly passed them on to the vendor. It seemed a genuine car, original 1970 UK RHD and the vendor's father was the second owner from 1995 when it was also restored. But I had noted a makeshift chassis plate and while I do not doubt its originality – to my knowledge there aren't any 'fake' Monteverdi's around - the real one would be better if it's to ever achieve a good price.





The engine was indeed a Chrysler 440 Magnum but the engine number indicated it had a 1974-76 block – clearly too late for a 1970 car. I wanted the story on this and other things but there was no info to be had. So sadly, I punted it. But it was a near miss and I would still like to own one.

So, doing well on my personal promise to myself of not buying more cars. Except that a Merc 560 SEC came up for sale. I had loved both my 300SEs and the 560SEC is the ultimate of the W126 species. A 5.5 Litre OHC V8, proper old school rumble and just

shy of 300bhp. Very elegant in my eyes though Lloyd can't stand the sight of them! Funny old world.

I accidentally found myself in Hampshire looking at this SEC. Boy it was nice. I had a good poke around. It had a few little rust stains round the sun roof (uh oh) but otherwise pretty good. Lots of fresh underseal mind you which tends to make me worry. It was a grimy day so unless I was 95% on buying it, I was not going to drive it and get it dirty. So I just fired it up...on 7 cylinders.

Hmm. Now I was thinking ignitor box and they are a Grand a go. The vendor thought it was a damp dizzy cap. I left it there and pondered on the way home. It was top priced and for that, it needed to be a 'no issues' car.



He messaged me the next day to say that it was a diaphragm in the throttle body. Not sure how that gets it to 7 cylinders but anyway it's apparently all OK now. But it had not got me over the line so I punted it.

Blimey – I must be getting pickier. That's probably a good thing.


