It's an uphill struggle

You can't beat a good mess.

Yes I have specialised in them since I was a young lad. Back in the day, my bedroom was full of slowly decomposing Autocars as the damp got to them. Stank like a haunted house, but I was oblivious, slowly peeling each copy off the next to do some back catalogue research on my future dream car. Once the next dream car had been identified – it was a new one each week – I could indulge in a spot of imaginary heel and toe under the bed sheets. Well that's what I called it anyway...

As winter rolled in and it got mighty chilly, we finally got started on the Fiat 128 and, with already full garages, it got messy very quickly.







Still the little blighter came apart better than expected and within 2 weeks we had most of the trim and fittings out ready to head on its way along with a couple of replacement panels. The substructure was looking good – removing the wheel arch liners called for a deep breath and a squint through one eye but no, it was all solid and I could breathe out again.

Meanwhile I was having a long and intense dialogue with myself trying to decide which Merc to sell or whether to sell them both for one replacement. Why? Well one more garage slot was going to be needed for the return of the Marcos and to avoid the need to house the Abarth in the trailer down in the warehouse. Of course it was possible but I didn't want to do that.

So I pondered. The obvious answer was to sell the SL55 as the C63 Black Series is a more usable 4 seater, newer and, I know this sounds a bit odd, simpler. The SL has ABC hydraulic suspension (a bit like a Citroen) with hydraulically adjustable anti-roll bars, a complex roof and supercharger. Lots of fun if it gives up the ghost. Which it wouldn't if it continued to be used regularly but, sat in the garage for long periods, I wasn't so sure. In contrast the C63, as modern and technically complex as it seems, has manual suspension, a normally aspirated motor and really very few gadgets. It's quite old school. Like its owner.

But Mrs J much preferred the SL – less shouty, softer riding and generally more debonair. So either I kept the C63 and took her out for a Tea and Victoria Sponge to make up for it or I sold both and looked for something suave to replace them.



Sifting through the options it quickly got out of hand. Maserati Ghibli? (Yes the proper one). Lamborghini Jarama? Another Espada? Fiat 2300S? Pagoda? Merc 500SEC?

Superformance continuation GT 40. She'd love a long continental tour in that with her luggage on her lap. Still, as a silver lining, noise would stifle any chance of conversation ...

Why didn't I buy that Monteverdi 375L project a few months back? Or the Merc 600 Grosser. Oh dear, time to see the quack and pop a Haliborange or two.

As all this mind madness was going on, Lloyd was well into his final year project on chassis set ups so we had a chaotic week of him trailering the – not quite ready – Marcos 1800 back home so he could take some measurements on our flat floor. Lots of jacking, lowering and measuring later and there was an impressive set of data. The headlines were good. Joe had managed to reduce weight sufficiently to offset the safety equipment, so we had a good starting point. Added to that, with Lloyd in the driver's seat the weight balance was 49% front, 51% rear which is near utopia for a front engined car.



Once done it was 'pack it away' time and a return to Redline for finishing. Nearly there. I was starting to plan some early testing. We both wanted to get on top of the car before attempting any expensive circuit racing so some hillclimbs or sprints in 2019 seemed a good start. And anyway we needed to get the FIA papers done and that's another story for another time.

With our estimates of the handicap based on the power and weight data, we reckoned it would come out close to the Mantis. To achieve that we would need to run 1A tyres, but a quick spin around the net found only 185/60s for a decent speed rating which are a bit too low in profile. As 1Bs, in 70 profile we could do a Pirelli CN36 (original tall carcasses but latest compound rubber) or Avon CR6ZZ (I like those – had them on the Espada but they are damned expensive). In the end we went for the Pirellis – just over half the price of the Avons and V rated.

We'll see. Off to the NEC Classic Car Show and an ogle. Not fussed on the new Alpine A110. Everyone says it's truly brilliant and I believe them but, well, it just looks so fat compared to the original. But then just look at a Porsche 992 against an original 2.0 SWB. David and Goliath. Driving an A110 would probably change my mind. I must try and find one to test.



Having looked at Ghiblis, Khamsins, an Espada and much more besides, I came to the strange conclusion (for me) that they were all over priced compared with a humble Volvo P1800. There sat an 18000 miler on its second owner, never restored and in a sort of Old English White. Worth less than 30K, no doubt, an 8th of the exotica, I reflected that, had I wanted

to set off in a Classic that morning and be sure to get there and back, the Volvo would have done the trick nicely. Have I just discovered the concept of value for money I wonder?

But... "Dear Santa, I have been a very good boy and everyone I know will vouch for that. I never swear, never make fun of those less fortunate and, many years ago, I passed my cycling proficiency test. I have even practiced the breast stroke, though I have never been able to swim. Please can I have a Marcos LM600 with a 6 litre Chevy V8"...

I was besotted. My C.O. was with me and she had to endure my 'reflections' for the rest of the day. How has she stuck it for 35 years?




